# TICKETS


Tickets - single or return - Ist, 2 nd or 3 rd class between any two stations in France and to the principal stations in France, can be obtained from the principal travel agencies.

## RESERVATION OF SEATS & SLEEPING BERTHS

Seats or sleeping berths can be reserved in advance through the principal travel agencies, and passengers are recommended in their own interests to take advantage of this facility. Similar reservations can be made for the return journey from the principal stations in France.

#### REGISTRATION OF LUGGAGE

Heavy luggage can be registered between any two railway stations in France and to most French destinations to which through tickets are issued, with a free allowance on the French Railways of 30 kg for adults and 20 kg for children between 4 and 10 years of age. Any excess weight must be paid for.
